

Your guide to the new and existing roles working with you in Manchester's communities.

Community Link Workers and Health Coaches (Be Well)

The Be Well service offers free, confidential, one-to-one advice and support for people referred by primary care (GPs and services provided from GP surgeries) or other health and care services. Be Well workers (Community Link Workers and Health Coaches) support people to identify what will improve their health and wellbeing, access community support and services, and develop understanding and skills to manage their own health. You may hear this approach referred to as 'social prescribing'.

Integrated Neighbourhood Team (INT) Leadership Teams

These 12 teams are part of Manchester Local Care Organisation's approach to ensure that health and care services work together, where people live, to best meet the needs of residents.

They co-ordinate day to day services that see NHS community healthcare staff working together in partnership with social workers where people live, and develop an annual neighbourhood plan that outlines the agreed priorities for their Neighbourhood.

Who's who in prevention and wellbeing

Neighbourhood Health Workers (Buzz)

On the ground' to improve health and wellbeing for people in their neighbourhood. They develop and support local networks and partnerships, link neighbourhood groups with local services and strategic partnerships, and deliver outreach projects to support local health and wellbeing priorities. Buzz also provides a 'knowledge and information' service for communities to access health and wellbeing information and training.

Care Navigators (Citywide)

Care Navigators work with people who have many health and care needs and are receiving support from different agencies.

Based within each Integrated Neighbourhood Team (INT), as well as in the hospital some of the time, their focus is in simplifying peoples' care journeys and supporting the INT to ensure that the multi-agency meetings are effective.

Health Development Coordinators

Health Development Coordinators bring health and social care services and staff together with voluntary and community sector groups and services, and other public sector and neighbourhood services. They support neighbourhoods to identify priorities and opportunities, develop and deliver plans, co-design local solutions, and access resources to build community capacity.

It is important to have the Flu vaccination because, while Flu is unpleasant for most people, it can be dangerous and even life threatening for some people, particularly those with certain health conditions.

Autumn and early Winter are the ideal times to have your Flu vaccine before Flu starts spreading. But you can get your vaccine later.
